#### **MESSAGE FROM MR PLIM**

Dear Parents and Carers

Whenever I show prospective parents around school, I talk a lot about the school values of Respect, Resilience and positive Relationships. I also share with parents that our aim at Highley is for children to leave here having (I) an appreciation of where they come from and a knowledge and a respect for the history and significance of the village together with the rich opportunities of the surrounding area and (2) that they have the resilience to aspire to be the best versions of themselves and aim high for their lives beyond primary education.

That is part of the reason we have developed the 'Highley 100+' passport which is coming out to you today in electronic format by email. Children will be given a hard copy of this after half term that will stay in school for class teachers to update with the children. The 'passport' is full of over 100 exciting and entertaining 'things to do' at each stage of school – it has been put together by children and staff, and is split into 4 sections: Early Years, Key Stage I (Year I and 2), Lower Key Stage 2 (Year 3 and 4) and Upper Key Stage 2 (Year 5 and 6), each with some suggested activities. Some are part of our curriculum and will be completed in school, and some are those you can do at home for little or no cost. We hope that the launch of the 'Highley 100+' offers lots of opportunities which sit outside of the subject-based curriculum and will help to contribute towards children's positive wellbeing.

On the subject of positive wellbeing, I was INUNDATED with conker entries this year; over 150 children entered a conker and incredibly, the top 3 were not tied for the podium positions! Congratulations to JJ in 3rd, Camden in 2nd and Arthur in 1st place! A special mention to Jack in Hazelwells who sent in the smallest conker he could find. In celebration assembly, I shared that I spent 2-hours hunting for conkers on Sunday with my own daughter...and despite rooting around, we could not find anything as small as the perfectly-formed tiny conker that Jack handed in, so a special mention for him! I am glad that so many of you were able to get outside for an autumnal walk to collect conkers, one of my favourite things to do at this time of year.

The discos last night seemed hugely successful – judging by the temperature on the dance floor! Mrs Butler did take some lovely photos of children in costume which we will share (once we've established who is wearing which maskl). Thank you to everybody from the PTA who came into school to decorate the hall, run the disco, sell refreshments and tidy everything up afterwards. Thank you also to Mrs Halliwell, Miss Nixon and Mrs Butler for staying after school to ensure children were ticked in and handed over safely (and Miss Nixon additionally for leading the Cha-Cha Slide).

It has been a very long 8-week half term, children are exhausted and in need of a rest so that they can return ready for all of the festivities of next half term. We have lots of exciting things going on after half term and we are already looking forward to it! A huge thank you to staff for their hard-work and dedication.
