

We had our half-termly register review with our Education Welfare Officer on Tuesday. It was fantastic to see some improvements in children's attendance, with 76 children maintaining 100% attendance! There are currently 46 children in the persistent absenteeism category (below 90%, this means that children have missed 5.5 or more days this year so far). 


RED = Under 90% AMBER = Under 96%



GREEN = Above 96%


