

We do understand that sometimes children are unable to attend school, however we are seeing an increased number of unauthorised absences which could be avoided. If you have any planned absences coming up, then please ensure that you let us know in advance so that we can inform children's teachers and minimise the impact on their learning. Overall attendance has been very turbulent across this term. As with punctuality, every class started well but this has declined. As you can see, each class is currently under our target of 96%.

There have been 63 out of 150 possible occasions where a class has achieved over 96% attendance. On a more positive note, we have given out attendance rewards to 134 children today who have achieved over 96% attendance for the term, with 55 children achieving 100% attendance! A big well done to them all. We look forward to seeing all children back in school on Thursday 4th January for the start of the spring term.
