This bulletin is about your simply amazing children!

I started writing this message just after midnight in the early hours of yesterday morning, sitting in the corridor at the Pioneer Centre, waiting for the last few children to drift off to sleep. Whether they have tried something new, climbed higher than they thought they could reach, tested a raft they had built or faced a fear, the opportunities that residential trips offer are remarkable – and as staff, we see talents, adaptability and resilience that we just do not get the opportunity to see when children are in school.

I was also lucky enough to travel to Ludlow with Year 3 to watch the whole year group perform on stage to a combined audience of 600 people over 2 shows on Tuesday evening. This was an incredible opportunity that the children will remember forever - the production of 'Gwendol the Giant' involved four Shropshire primary schools, including Highley, and brought together drama, singing and dance following the workshops delivered here in school. One school had written a song with a professional songwriter, one school performed some drama they had scripted with a drama specialist…and we worked with the wonderful Sally Sixsmith to develop and perform a dance telling the actual story of Gwendol the Giant! I know I am bias, but we DEFINITELY got to do the best part and I am sure parents and carers who watched would agree!

Year 3 had to be extremely patient all day with lots of waiting around; taking our chances when we had them to practise our section. We were moved from room to room and the children probably saw every nook and cranny of the theatre! But I have to report that your children were utterly sensational all day, they listened superbly, they didn't moan and their performance was polished to perfection – on behalf of all the staff who went with Year 3, we were SO SO proud of each and every one of them.

Staff who attend activities; whether it is a long day and evening for a theatre production, or a 3-day residential, give up their own time away from their families to ensure that the children gain amazing experiences – so a <u>huge</u> thank you to all the staff that have been involved in events this week, I really do appreciate it and I know parents have shared that sentiment with me in abundance this week,

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Support in School

Our SEND team continues to provide tailored interventions, including small group work and one-toone support. SEND and Pastoral Support

Each fortnight, Miss Francis and myself discuss the children who may be having pastoral support as well as SEND interventions. This enables us to ensure that the support is as effective as it can be. We work closely with those delivering nurture across the school (whether informally or in the Sunshine Room) to ensure that children's Social, Emotional and Mental Health needs are met as well as their academic needs.

Next week will be a little bit different for me as I will be putting the finishing touches to my SENDCo training portfolio. This is a course that I am legally required to do as the SENDCo of our school. It has been extremely challenging but has also opened my eyes to numerous possibilities that can be implemented at Highley to make our SEND provision even more effective. Watch this space!
