Dear Parents and Carers,

On Wednesday afternoon, Miss Nixon and Miss Humphries went to Oldbury Wells and met some of our children from Year I and 2 who ran in the cross country event. For some, it was the first sports event they have attended to represent school. ALL the children ran their best race. We had a 2nd place in the Year 2 girls' race for Arabella and a special mention for Georgia in Year I who showed true Highley resilience. Thank you to Miss Nixon and Miss Humphries for your help and support, and also to parents for getting children there. The cost of transport for events and trips has increased dramatically over the last 2-years, so we really appreciate you taking children to these sorts of events, allowing them the opportunity to take part and represent Highley.

In 2-weeks' time, we are having a focus on 'aspiration' during the week 20th-24th May. We have had a small number of videos sent to us from people talking about the jobs they do, but we would really love to include some from parents/carers. Videos can be short (no longer than 5 mins), talking about what you do, where you work, the best bits of the job, and what qualifications/experience you need to have to get into it. Thank you in advance - it would be lovely to share examples from our own school community!

Since returning from Easter, the number of children arriving late has crept up. Please remember that the gate closes at 8:50am. Those first few minutes of the day are so important for children to feel settled and ready to learn.

The Brilliant Brushers scheme that Clee class have piloted this year for the NHS Oral Hygiene Improvement team, have offered to donate enough water bottles to school for every child in Reception, Year I and Year 2 from September. Children in these year groups will have their own water bottle that stays in school. These will be refilled daily - more will be communicated by letter next week.

Finally, as part of our focus on local history and geography, our Year 3 and 4 children were guided around the village by Mrs Venables earlier this week, spotting features and buildings that children may otherwise miss when out and about. Children learned about the significance of some of the historic buildings in the village, as well as understanding how and why Highley has developed over time. Make sure you ask the children what they can remember, and to show you something new they found out!

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

A Quick Guide To Head lice

Symptoms & Detection

The main symptom is an itchy scalp. Children may hardly notice head lice or may have only minor scalp irritation.

Move a fine tooth comb through wet hair from the scalp outward. Lice are usually found at the back of the head or behind the ears.

Eggs (or nits) are oval-shaped, greyish white and can be seen firmly stuck to the base of hair shafts. They are easier to see because they greatly outnumber lice.

Care

Use a special shampoo, cream or lotion to kill the lice eggs. To get rid of them, use a fine tooth comb to carefully pick them out.

Wash your bedding and clothes in hot water. These items should probably be dried in a drying machine that reaches 54 degrees Celsius for about 30 minutes.

Transmission

Headlice are most common among children aged 5-II, but can affect almost anyone. The infestation is spread by close personal contact and possibly by shared combs, brushes, hats and other personal items.

Netherlon


