Dear Parents and Carers.

Year 6 have been simply incredible this week - they have absolutely 'rocked' their SATS!



Myself, the Year 6 staff team and all of the volunteers who have helped have commented on how our children have remained calm and unfazed, approaching their special tests with confidence. What has been lovely to see is the support they have shown each other as a group that has really shone through. As a year group, they have worked their socks off to prepare themselves and genuinely could not have tried any harder, which is all we can ask.

Next week is national 'Walk to School Week' and although we have been tracking children's journeys to school throughout the spring term and since Easter, I explained in assembly this morning that we really want to encourage <u>all</u> the children to try and walk, scoot, cycle or 'park and stride' to school <u>at least once next week</u> so that they can all go home with a special badge.

Bikeability for our Year 6 children is on the horizon and starts at the end of next month. Please look out for a consent form - for children to take part, they will need a roadworthy cycle and a cycle helmet that fits securely.

To promote active travel and cycling/scooting safety, we are also looking at creating an opportunity for children to bring their bikes or scooters into school for a 'scootathon/bikeathon' around our daily mile track. They will need a suitable cycle helmet to be able to take part.

Last week, I mentioned how we approach the SATs tests with our SEND learners. It is testament to our school and all staff that all of the children took the tests completely in their stride.




